



# Introduction Letter from Dr. Dominique Roe-Sepowitz

### Spotlight on a Researcher:

#### Einat Peled, PhD

Einat Peled is a Full Professor and the Head of the Bob Shapell School of Social Work at Tel Aviv University. Throughout her academic career, she has sought both to expand and to challenge the understanding of gendered dynamics in social work theory and practice. Her research is focused on the domains of domestic violence, at-risk youth, mothering under violence and duress, and – in the last decade – prostitution, commercial sexual exploitation (CSE), and paying for sex.



As a critical constructivist qualitative researcher, many of her studies center on developing a theoretical understanding of the experiences, perceptions, and identities of people whose lives have been impacted by violence, abuse, and marginalization – and of their interactions with social care systems. A continuing focus of her research is on at-risk youth. She has explored the gendered experiences of runaway and CSE adolescents, the experiences of CSE Israeli youth, and the perceptions guiding professional interventions with them. As part of developing knowledge aimed to advance best professional practice with this population. Einat and her colleagues have recently completed a two-year evaluation study of a therapeutic intervention program for sexually exploited youth, and a longitudinal study on helping people in prostitution during the COVID-19 crisis, and are currently conducting a large qualitative study on help-seeking of commercially sexually exploited youth from an intersectional perspective. Finally, Einat is committed to expanding the knowledge on men who pay for sex. Her studies in this domain focus on the experience of Israeli men who have paid for sex; the attitudes of Israeli men toward paying for sex; the identity construction of men who pay for sex, and gendered power relations in interviews with men who pay for sex. All her research on prostitution and the sex industry is guided by and aims to facilitate a complex, multifaceted theoretical understanding of this personal and social phenomena. Her commitment to expanding research- and theorybased knowledge in this domain in Israel has led her (with colleagues) to found the Israeli Association for the Study of Prostitution, Sex Work and Sex Trafficking (IASPSS), in 2019. In the past two years the IASPSS has held two annual conferences and a monthly forum for Graduate and Post-Doc Israeli students whose research is focused on this domain.
